### Science and Religion in Conversation: Seeking the Common Good

**Speaker: Robert Allore, SJ**

Fr Rob Allore is a research scientist at the Samuel Lunenfeld Research Institute at Mt. Sinai Hospital. His research activities are focussed on questions pertaining to the genetic regulation of the development of the nervous system. He teaches in the Human Biology program at the University of Toronto and is active at the Newman Centre. The lecture will discuss recent developments in the life sciences along with the opportunities and challenges they create for public dialogue between the traditions of science and religion.

Robert Allore, SJ, is a member of the Jesuits in English Canada. He received a BSc (Biology) from the University of Ottawa and a PhD (Immunology) from the University of Toronto. He studied philosophy and medical ethics at Loyola University in Chicago. During his theology studies (MDiv, STL) at Regis College he developed a special interest in the role of religious voices in the public dialogue on questions of science and technology.
