WILLIAM SULLIVAN, MD, PHD

Bill Sullivan, founding director of the
Canadian Catholic Bioethics Institute,
Member of the Pontifical Academy for Life,
and Executive Director of the International
Association of Catholic Bioethicists, is a
family physician and Associate Professor in
the Department of Family and Community
Medicine of the University of Toronto.

Dr Sullivan is engaged in service, teaching, and
research at St Michael's Hospital and Surrey
Place Centre, a University of Toronto affiliate
that supports people with developmental
disabilities. Dr Sullivan also teaches ethics to
residents in family medicine at St Michael's
Hospital and is a member of the research
ethics board of Surrey Place Centre.

Dr Sullivan specializes in the care of the
elderly and people with developmental and
intellectual disabilities. He is director of an
initiative sponsored by Surrey Place Centre,
the Ontario Ministry of Community and
Social Services, and the Ministry of Health
and Long Term Care that has developed
Canadian guidelines, resources, and a training
program for physicians and nurses on the

primary care of adults with developmental
and intellectual disabilities.

He is the author of *Eye of the Heart: Knowing
the Human Good in the Euthanasia Debate* as
well as numerous book chapters and articles,
and has edited several books including *Stem
Cell Research and Regenerative Medicine*.
