Dr Mary Vachon, RN, MA, PhD, nurse, psychotherapist, author, and cancer survivor, is an international lecturer on issues related to occupational stress, cancer, bereavement, survivorship, and spirituality. Her publications include "The Emotional Care of the Dying Person" for the Oxford Textbook of Palliative Medicine. Dr Vachon is a psychotherapist and consultant in private practice; professor in the Departments of Psychiatry and Public Health Sciences, University of Toronto, and Clinical Consultant at Wellspring, which she co-founded.

She has been honoured with the Mara Morgenson Flaherty Lectureship of the Oncology Nursing Society for Excellence in Psychosocial Oncology; the Carmelita Lawlor Lectureship in Community Palliative Care, University of Toronto; the Dorothy Ley Award for Excellence in Palliative Care; the National Hospice and Palliative Care, Distinguished Researcher Award, for her continued contribution to the field of palliative care from the beginning of the specialty until the present time; and the Lifetime Achievement Award of 2008 of The International Journal of Palliative Nursing.

Joseph Chandrakanthan, PhD, ThD is a bioethicist in the Centre for Clinical Ethics and the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. He is Associate Professor in the Department for the Study of Religion, University of Toronto.
